

Welcome to the real Tour of Germany (Deutschlandtour).

For all of you who are infected by the "Caching-Fever" we have the ultimate Challenge. The one who accepts it has to find all the caches of this series for entering the hall of fame. Therefore one has to visit all of the 16 German states and their capitals to calculate the coordinates of the "Megacache".

All 16 caches can be found on the published bookmark-list.

You are at the cache „Deutschlandtour – Bremen“

At the given start coordinates you will find the Patron of the City of Bremen – The Roland. In 2004, it was declared World Heritage Site – together with the town-hall. It is one of Bremen's landmarks.

The statue is 5.47 m tall and stands on a podium of 60 cm in height. Supported by a column which is crowned by a ciborium the Roland has a total height of 10.21 m.

because you need to find out the distance of the spikes at Roland's knees. (This information can not be found at the English Wikipedia. So you will have to look for it at the German Wikipedia or you will have to visit the Roland, bringing a measuring tape with you ;-)

It is exactly a "Bremer Elle" (Bremer cubit). The value be **ABCDE** (without point).

Looking from the Roland you will find the cache in a distance of **(B-E) (D+E) (A-E)** meters and a bearing of **(3 x C) (C x E)** degrees.

Have fun searching this cache and even more fun in the city of Bremen.

Please leave the picture (outline of Germany with a number) in the cache.

Watch out for muggers, please hide the cache at the same position and cover it up again.
